



# Sydney Coarse Angling Club

## Match - Section Scoring

In order to increase interest in match events, this year has been agreed to introduce, on a trial basis, *Section Scoring* as well as the usual scoring. *Section scores* will form a **separate** table and will **not** be added to the *Match* table.

- One point will be awarded to <u>each</u> section winner. No points for second or third will be awarded. At the end of the year the angler to accrue the highest number of points will be the winner.
- If two or more anglers have the same number of points, the total weight of tish caught in the year will determine the winner.
- Prize: to be determined by the committee (it may be a trophy or a cash prize: a once-only entry fee may be charged).
- The number of sections will depend on the number of participants and on the venue.
- © All pegs in a section will be sequential.
- The minimum number of anglers in each section is 4.
- The maximum number of anglers in each section is 6.
- € If a duly assigned peg is left vacant, such peg WILL count in the relevant section.
- € ALL 12 matches can accrue points.
- 3 All other rules of match fishing will apply.
- E All rules will be reviewed at the end of the year

## Sydney International Regatta Course

### <u>1/2 The Leisure Day Report</u> 21 July 1996

For several months now most of you will have listened to me raving about this venues potential and so today the first of our hopefully many visits took place. Peter Byron the manager of the course teed it up so that we would meet the Ranger at 8.00am, unfortunately Howard did not get the message and fronted at the crack of dawn (I can say this now that Richard has returned to the UK). The ranger turned up right on cue, for the life of me I can't remember his name, but a nicer bloke you could not meet, although his eyes misted over just slightly when I did a Rex and pretended to kiss old rubber lips before letting him swim away.

It was decided that we would split into two groups so that the practice course and a retention lake could be sussed to enable the venue management and the club to appraise the options. The gobbledock popeye and I took the soft option by fishing the retention lake out of the howling wind, while Eric, Fluro, Mr t, Robin, and John, fished the practice area. You now know why I titled this half a report as Eric will provide a report on the events at his section.

The retention lakes banks are devoid of trees and the water is in a huge hollow so it's mostly sheltered from the wind. Howard and I sat with what wind there was at our backs while Ron fished about 200 meters or half way down the bank. Where Ron was fishing was bottomless at 4 rod lengths, 10' at 3 and 6' at 2, I had about 8' at 3 with a sloping bottom while Howard had 4-5' across the swim. Ron chased carp, while Howard and I went for eels as well as carp. After the first pouch of maggots the water started to boil with small fish so Howard and I set up whips and produced Australian Smelt. After an hour I managed an eel of about 6lb and Ron got his first carp of about 8lb followed by another of 14lb. That was about it so at 1.00pm we decided to visit the others to find 2 foot waves and only Eric and Robin still clinging to there box in the galeforce wind. The fishing was much better at this area than the retention lake with all catching carp probably in excess of 150lb between them. I managed to poach a common of about 4lb on Robins gear to win the day with three species.

On a personal note thanks Eric for the whip and thanks Mark for thanking me for my efforts to gain access to this venue it's nice to know I am appreciated at least for some of the time. For those of you who noticed the garbage bags containing dead carp I will be trying to stop this by using sense and reason, however please don't try to change things by getting all hot and bothered as it looks like this venue will be the first catch and release water in Aus probably because our rules were used as the basis for the management policy.

### The Leisure Day at Penrith Lakes

In atrocious conditions, eight members fished the Penrith Lakes complex on Sunday, 21st July.

With winds gusting to 50 Kph and temperatures around 11°C, it was clearly not going to be an auspicious start to the first visit to this venue, or so we thought.

The complex currently consists of three lakes, all of which are joined.

There is a rowing course of approximately 100 acres, the practice lake of about the same size and the top up lake which I estimate to be between 7-10 acres.

Five members fished the eastern end of the practice lake whilst three fished the topup lake.

Like the Carrum Rowing Course in Victoria, the practice lake has a ledge of 5' to 6' in depth, dropping away to 12'+ at about three rod lengths out. The only exception noted in the areas fished, was the extreme eastern end of the lake where the drop off is much further out.

The predominant baits used were corn, worm and bread, with corn being the most successful.

A variety of methods were used including feeder and straight ledger but a waggler, either fixed or sliding, was the most successful method on the day.

A total of 16 fish were caught on the Practice Lake, all of which were Common Carp.

Robin Ballard and Mark Triston who fished in the deep water over the shelf with sliders, produced fish to 10 lb with the average being in the 5-7 lb range.

I was fishing a fixed waggler in the shallow Eastern end of the lake and took four fish, the biggest of which weighed 14 lb.

In the top-up lake Ron Waites had two Common Carp, the largest of which scaled 14 lb. 7 oz., while Steve and Howard produced Australian Smelt and long finned eels.

Reflecting on the day, the fact that so many fish (21 in all) were caught under such conditions makes it clear that this is a venue of considerable potential.

The species caught obviously reflect the baits and methods used and future outings to the complex should focus on live baits to determine if bass or other predatory species are present.

The complex itself is a tribute to the controlling body, the water quality is excellent as is the layout.

This facility has enormous potential as a leisure and match fishing venue and in it we have in N.S.W. for the first time, a venue which could hold major competitions of over 200 pegs, such as the Australian National Championships or even the World Championships.

I believe it is important that we make the management of the complex aware of the contribution that recreational fishing could make to the economic viability of the complex.

Clearly the capital cost of such an enterprise, as well as the ongoing cost of maintenance, means that the complex should support as wide a range of fee paying activities as possible.

We should also, I believe, point out that the indiscriminate removal of species such as Carp could damage the waters potential as a fishing venue.

On behalf of the Club, I would like to thank the Penrith Lakes Corporation for the opportunity to fish the complex and, in particular, the Ranger Jason Brown for this help and interest on the day.

#### Dear Peter,

Thankyou for the opportunity of attending the Sydney International Regatta Center for the purposes of conducting an experimental Coarse Angling visit to determine fish type, water quality, and if the venue is suitable for conducting match angling events etc. Although the wind conditions on the day of the visit were very unfavorable for angling we were able to determine that SIRC. is without question the best potential venue in Sydney and would be in the top 5 in the Australian Coarse Angling arena.

The fish species captured on the day of the visit were Australian Smelt, Long Finned Eels, and Common Carp, it is presumed that Eel Tailed Catfish, Galaxia and Mirror Carp are also present, this presumption is based on the clubs attendance at Wheelers Lake. All fish caught were inspected before release and were found to be in excellent condition with no parasitic infestation found. The water quality was found to be good with little turbidity despite the conditions, combined with this plant and other aquatic life such as Cormorants and Ducks seem to regard the venue favorably. One issue that might require attention at the venue is that of Ribbon Weed which if unchecked may overgrow the margins and shallower areas of the lake system.

One aspect of the SIRC. that was not appreciated was the sight of garbage bags full of dead Carp. The removal of Carp from this venue in our opinion is unwarranted and indeed may be creating a larger problem for the Penrith Lakes Development Corporation. Because of the construction of the lake system and the structures within the Carp will not cause damage to the banks, etc. and the removal of the species is an unrequired financial burdon that is detrimental to the asset that Carp provide in terms of national and international competition.

The Sydney Coarse Angling Club has no problem with the control of Carp where they are in plague proportions, however this is not the case at the SIRC. and the removal of large Carp will allow for the proliferation of small fish. It is respectfully suggested that fish stocks need to be managed appropriately i.e. leave the Carp alone and introduce a predatory species such as Australian Bass (as approved by NSW Fisheries ). This measure will result in an aquatic system that is balanced between large Carp and large Bass, as the Bass will keep the Carp population in check by feeding on fingerlings. It should also be noted that Carp and Bass do not generally feed on the same part of the aquatic food chain and that the Carp population may assist in keeping the Ribbon Weed issue to that of financially viable proportions. Further to this it should be noted that Bass do not reproduce in still water, and because of the Cormorant population and the potential removal of these fish by the general angling population will have to be stocked on a regular basis. On a final note at present there is no requirement to kill Carp upon capture in NSW. and as such a strict catch and release policy as you have previously mentioned is both logical for all fish and not currently in conflict with either statute law or National or International Coarse Angling rules.

Once again thankyou very much for your cooperation, the SIRC, is an excellent venue with undoubted national and international potential. I will be in contact with you in the near future to arrange a second visit to determine the retention lakes potential prior to our planned match competitions. If I or the club can be of any assistance in the future for stocking information or other issues please do not hesitate to contact the undersigned.

## Parramatta Pound 04/08/96 - Match report

After the poor results of the Werrington Lake match, most anglers were looking forward to today's match for some serious fishing. It hadn't rain for a few days and the weather forecast for a sunny day was more than encouraging. So much so that we had the largest turn up for a LONG time, with 15 participants. But the devil decided to throw a spanner in the works by adding strong gusty winds to what would have been a rather nice day fishing.

Most people decided to leave the pole in the bag, and this is indicative. Soon, despite being on the sunny side of the river, I witnessed a pilgrimage of anglers going back to the car to get more clothing, some were holding on to their umbrella and I made sure that I put all my lead in my pockets. Ron (had drawn the end peg) braved the elements and used successfully the pole by fishing close to the banks. At my end Mark, that for once had the luck of the draw (No 1), was quietly but quickly drawing attention (both of passer by and of envious fellow fishermen) with numerous catches. Steve thought that he was doing all right fishing with pole 11 metres out until one good gust of wind spun him out and almost picked Michael's nose.

Andy decided that had better things to do and packed up early, while I hung on and eventually caught a tiny eel (which a was praying would not bite me off) to give me a whole 7.5 ounces and one point. Needless to say the "all out" could not come quickly enough for most. Mark had to wait quite a bit to find out whether he had won or not, but the only real contender was Robin (yes him again), that could afford to lose an eel trough a hole his keepnet and still get second spot (only a few ounces behind Mark). And if he continues this way (2 wins and 3 second spots out of five), we might have to consider and handicap system for our scoring. Also doing well at this stage is Howard that consolidated his second spot on the ladder.

So now we are all eagerly waiting to fish the Olympic Rowing Course at Penrith. In a trial not long ago, it produced well in conditions as bad as at the Pound, with plenty of LARGE fish caught; so if the weather is touch more merciful, we should have a great time. But **REMEMBER**, that access to this venue on the day of the match will be restricted. A security guard will open the gates for us and then he will **LOCK** them up again behind us. **MEETING TIME IS 6.30** AM, but I suggest that you aim to get there at 6.15 am. It is also best that you confirm with me (or other members) that you are coming. **DON'T BE LATE OR YOU WILL BE LOCKED OUT.**



IT'S war. A David and Goliath battle for su-premacy of Sydney's major water supplies has begun between two of the most aggressive fish species alive.

On one side is the giant introduced noxious carp which grows to 14.5kg and has infested Fitzroy Falls dam, threatening the water quality of one of Sydney's major supplies.

On the other is a 50.000-strong army of 5cm baby Australian bass — regarded as one of the best fighting fish in the world in the world.

Yesterday the predatory bass. once native to the area before it was dammed, were released by NSW Fisheries and Sydney Water in an ex-periment to cull the carp using another predatory species.

"Fitzroy Falls is a cru-cial back-up water system and the carp have the potential to reduce

the water quality," a Sydney Water spokes-man said.

"A bottom dweller, they increase turbidity and destroy the ecology of the system."

Carp have also in-fested, to a lesser ex-tent, Warragamba catchment - Sydney's main water supply.


It is hoped the bass, which experts claim "are smart and will bite at anything that moves", will eat immature carp and larvae almost immediately upon entering the water.


