

Match Report For 1997-1998 Season

This season the title proved to be quite exciting to the point that a last minute fish changed the outcome in favour of Steve Scott for first spot against Ron Waits. Also the battle for third spot was decided at the last match with Robin maintaining his gap over Mark Triston. The sections winner was aslo snatched by Steve again at the last match.

Attendance has again improved: a few people weren't able to come EVERY week as they would have liked but quite a few new members (welcome to you all) bumped up the figures.

The Sydney International Regatta Centre again holds the highest number of contestants with a club record of 20 (It would have been 21 but Simon's car did not want to take him fishing on that day). But Parramatta Park also has a respectable 17 while Canberra had an impressive match with 19 anglers.

Finally the overall weight of fish caught has also gone up to 1480 lb compared with the figure of just over 1300 lb caught last season. Also the average per person per match has increased slightly from 7.7 lb to 8.1 lb. The top catch of Ron from SIRC last year has not quite been matched, but still John Moses produced a remarkable 75.12 lb (at SIRC again) with a massive overall weight of 226.10.08.

This has been again a very competitive and very successful season and I am looking forward to an even bigger and better one next season. See you there.

S.A.S. REPORT SEASON 1997-98

Well it's that time of the year again and reports have to be written to tell you all how well the S.A.S. and other sections went.

I wish I could tell you of some sensational large specimens and that the 100lb match bag was achieved but unfortunately that is not the case, so this report is going to be pretty short.

The season started quite good with an organised Interstate trip to Canberra. I have already written a report on this trip back in July but to cut a long story short, Howard landed a Common Carp for 15lb-8oz, which stands as the seasons best, subject to a claim by Bill for a 4lb-4oz Silver Perch. This will be verified when my scales are checked against the club scales and the S.A.S. qualification list is checked. Bills Perch was caught at Fairfield City Farm, more about that later.

There has been three non metro trips this season that I know of, two in Canberra and one at Fitzroy Falls. The second trip to Canberra included Peter Shires last fishing trip with the club. We had a go at the 5 hour match weight record but with no luck, had some nice Redfin Perch to about 12oz and Carp on all methods but no big ones. All the action was at Tuggeranong Lake.

The trip to Fitzroy was another attempt at the 5 hour match record but once again no luck with that. A few Carp were landed but not in quantity. In the last few months before writing, there has been a few trips to the Fairfield City Farm dam. This little dam has been closed for a time due to Bluegreen Algae but has reopened after an Aerator has been installed in the water. The dam has been stocked with natives and Rainbow Trout only, with a few Eels in attendance.

Bill and Howard have had some good fish from this venue, mostly on maggots and worms with a nice Eel on ledgered tinned Mussel, unfortunately it wasn't weighed.

Two years ago, I was catching Silvers on the feeder with Maggots from this dam to about 2lb, now they are running in the 4lb plus bracket. This little dam has got good potential for specimen fish and I think we should give it a closer look next season but remember, go midweek as you will get pestered by the locals on weekends.

I've had a few phone calls from members during the season to tell me of trips that they had arranged but I've not received any feed back on how they went or what was caught if any.

Well that's it from me for this season.

Round 10 - Parramatta Park - 5 April 1998 <u>Match Report</u>

Today was our first club match at the Park. The upper stretch of the river was chosen because this fired a lot better at the fun match organised with our interstate friends (and rival). Numbers were high with two new members (Mark Bryant and Gaetano Amorosi) being welcomed to the match scene. Actually we just managed to squeeeeeze 17 anglers in it. It would be impossible to fit anymore without sacrificing something. As it turned out it was difficult enough with Ralph and myself having to contend with powerlines over our heads.

The horn signalled the start of the match and timed and we all started to wait eagerly the arrival of the first fish; Danny and I were only meters away from where he had won his section the previous week and we were anticipating a good outcome. Danny managed one good fish that put up quite a fight, but nothing else seemed to be following. Closer to the footbridge we could see the odd fish being caught, but certainly nothing to rave about.

Time was ticking away slowly; very slowly indeed, then around the three hour mark Stewart (two pegs upstream of where I was) landed his first fish on the pole, followed immediately by one caught by John Moses right next to me. I looked at Danny and we both thought that the fish must have started to come down stream so we were expecting the float to bury underwater at any time. But it never did!!! John kept catching, even when his top section of his new pole snapped and had to spend some time to make the pole functional again. Indeed his pole seemed to work even better and the fish never ventured out of his peg. Stewart caught another couple but it was definitively John that stole the show with over 31 pounds of fish. Mark Tristan and I were on either side of John and Stewart but never got a touch.

Downstream were not more exciting: Danny finished with one fish only (of almost 9lb), then the rest was a seasore of blanks and small weights. Upstream Ron, on peg one managed almost 13lb closely beaten by Colin.

An interesting venue that needs further testing and a smaller number of anglers unless we change the rules to accommodate two fully independent sections with independent scores.

Round 11 - S.-I.R.C. - 3 May 1998 (Unbelievable) Match Report

On the other hand Steve did most of his fishing from tow trucks, but found casting a bit difficult. He hooked onto some animal that would not give in, and at that

time he was not using the tow truck cable, so he lost the fish. Indeed he spent most of the time chasing tow trucks and ended up with an empty net. Rumours say that when the tow truck eventually arrived, it also got bogged. So another tow truck was called to remove the first tow truck and Steve's car. BUT, when this arrived it ALSO got bogged. Round 12 - S.I.R.C. - 7 June 1998 (Final) Match Report

For the final match of the year there were some logistic problem to take into account long before the horn was played. Contrary to past years' trend, the impression was that many anglers would have taken part. While in many cases this would have hardly mattered, this last match was scheduled for Parramatta Park due to the recent draining of the Pound. But in there we could not fit more than 16 anglers without risking possible protests. Noticeably the number of bass was down from the previous match. The same goes for catfish, alltough Gaetano landed a nice one and that mean that he was actually leading the match for quite some time (well done Gaetano). But eventually the carp arrived for some! Stewart on the end peg landed a couple, Bill (who broke the hoodoo) and Howard also landed one. John Moses then landed the most. He seems that a special feeling with this venue with two wins and a second spot out of five matches here. This time he did with over 42 lb to win the match (not from and end peg) and the knock out series. But the catch of the day belongs Steve: Ron, one point ahead of him was blanking, and so was Steve, but, here come the BIG but, with two minutes from the horn, Steve hooks what he thinks it's a large turtle, but it turns out that it is a large carp of close to then pounds landed only second before the end. You can imagine the words that came out of his mouth as he put the fish into the net. Then the circumstances must have taken the best out of him and got incredibly quite, without moving: from a distance it almost looked like disappointment, to the point that Ron screamed in joy thinking that he might have lost it. But it wasn't to be, and the championship it's his. Perhaps that luck that deserted him the previous match, came back today to rescue him; then again lady luck this year has helped him on a few occasions making him extra dangerous (for the others). Congratulation to Steve and to Ron (despite the bad luck) for a great championship. Well done also to Robin in third place.

This venue proved again to be unpredictable and erratic with several but interesting enough most of the spots that blanked on the previous match did blank or did quite poorly this time as well. Something to keep in mind if we'll be using the same stretch for our next match.

Dear Peter

I thought that it would be appropriate for the Sydney Coarse Angling Club Inc and myself to extend our appreciation for the tremendous support that you and the staff of the regatta centre have provided for the club competitions. Further to this the following is a summary of our catches and observations that you may find of use.

A total five club matches were fished with two additional attendances for a teams event and the State of Origin event. The two latter events while successful did not form part of the club championship and as such the results were not recorded.

Observations

Generally the attending anglers were very pleased with the performance of the venue with the exception of the ribbon weed which caused some difficulties in the successful landing of fish. Aside from this the fish in this lake would have to be the fittest encountered at any of our venues due to the high standard of water quality.

In October the first Bass was caught and since then have been a regular part of the total catch. There size ranges \(^{1}4.lb - ^{3}4lb\), currently the Bass are feeding of aquatic insects and small fish probably Australian Smelt. We know this as Bass have the habit of throwing up after capture, it may be possible that they are also feeding on carp fry as we have never caught juvenile carp at this venue. We should be able to confirm this next season after the adult carp have spawned.

In February the first Eel Tailed Catfish was caught and in the May match at least 40lb were taken. We suspect that these fish are from the stocked population and there size ranges from 1 – 2lbs.

In summary the fish population seems to be reaching a balanced state with more diversity and an apparent decrease in the carp numbers. As our association continues with the venue we will keep you informed.

SYDNEY International Regatta Centre's European carp population is "under control", following a successful water managment strategy.

However, Penrith Lakes Development Corporation senior engineer Peter McGhee, said the corporation must remain vigilant.

The corporation's strategy is to develop and maintain a healthy aquatic eco-system.

Mr McGhee said carp, which forage at the bottom and stir up muddy water, was a major management issue in rivers throughout the State

He said they were a problem if left unchecked.

"Last season we started removing the large carp and also introduced Australian bass, fingerlings and also some pregnant Australian catfish.

"The bass are carnivores and eat the young carp and the catfish eat the carp eggs."

Mr McGhee said an Australian Water Technologies (AWT) survey during the last week had picked up 450 Australian bass, 320 catfish, a couple of cels, a couple of smelt, gudgeons and about half a dozen carp in the lake.

"That's the reason we are excited about it," he said.

"That's an early indication that our strategies are working.

"At the moment they're under control. We will never be able to remove all the carp, but we need to be able to control the population — they breed like rabbits," he said.
